Council is proposing to relocate it to the Reserve vested in Council as Recreation Reserve bordered by Tip Road and the Goomalling—Calingiri Road. The reason being the Go Kart Club have requested a new site to address the noise factor effecting the town site and Council is also keen to make use of the track area to extend the Caravan Park, the old school building would remain as the Men's Shed.



Environmental Health & Building

I'm leaving... But coming back!

In early July I will be settling into semi-retirement after spending 10 years with the Shire as the Environmental Health Officer and Registered Building Surveyor.

Currently there is a shortage of people in those 2 professions and Council has engaged me to work from home having remote access to my office computer and using technology such as email, Skype and mobile phone.

I will visit Goomalling 2 days a month to do the checks and inspections that are required under Health Act and the Building Act and Regulations. The everyday normal work can be done from my home office.

Skype is a computer program where you can have a one on one visual conversation with another Skype user, anywhere in the world, for free. This will be setup on a computer in the Shire office which you can use to contact me.

Staff will scan and email to me your Plans and Specifications and if too large, they can be posted to me for checking and issuing a building Permit. Similarly, that will be the way I will send them back. Once everything is set up, contact details will be made available.

Building Plans

When lodging your building plans it is very important that you obtain the "building envelope" from this office and take note of the contents and instructions therein.

This will save a lot of time in processing the plan because you will have been able to provide all the necessary information. Please make sure your contact details are on the front of the envelope in case I need to contact you for clarification or the need of further information.

Swimming Pools

The pool season is over but you still need to be vigilant in ensuring the pool is not accessible by toddlers and young children.

You need to winterise your pool and maintain clear water and if you have a salt pool I found that just maintaining the salt level and running the pool and chlorinator for 1.5 hours in the late afternoon, provided enough chlorine to keep the water clear and avoiding black spot. I never used any other chemicals.

Disposal of Tyres

We know that there is a lot of tyres up at the go-kart track BUT they and the Council do not want any more!!

Some people are dumping tyres up there and this has to stop as there are just too many.

Therefore Council has ordered that any person dumping tyres will be fined under the Litter Act \$500 for individuals and \$2,000 for businesses. Farming is classified as a business.

Whilst we are loathed to take tyres at the Refuse Disposal Facility, if you bring them you will have to pay a minimum of \$7.00 per tyre at the time of disposal. If you try and hide them under your rubbish, you will be fined \$500 or \$2,000 as per the penalties of the Litter Act. So, don't hide them, declare them to the site attendants.
