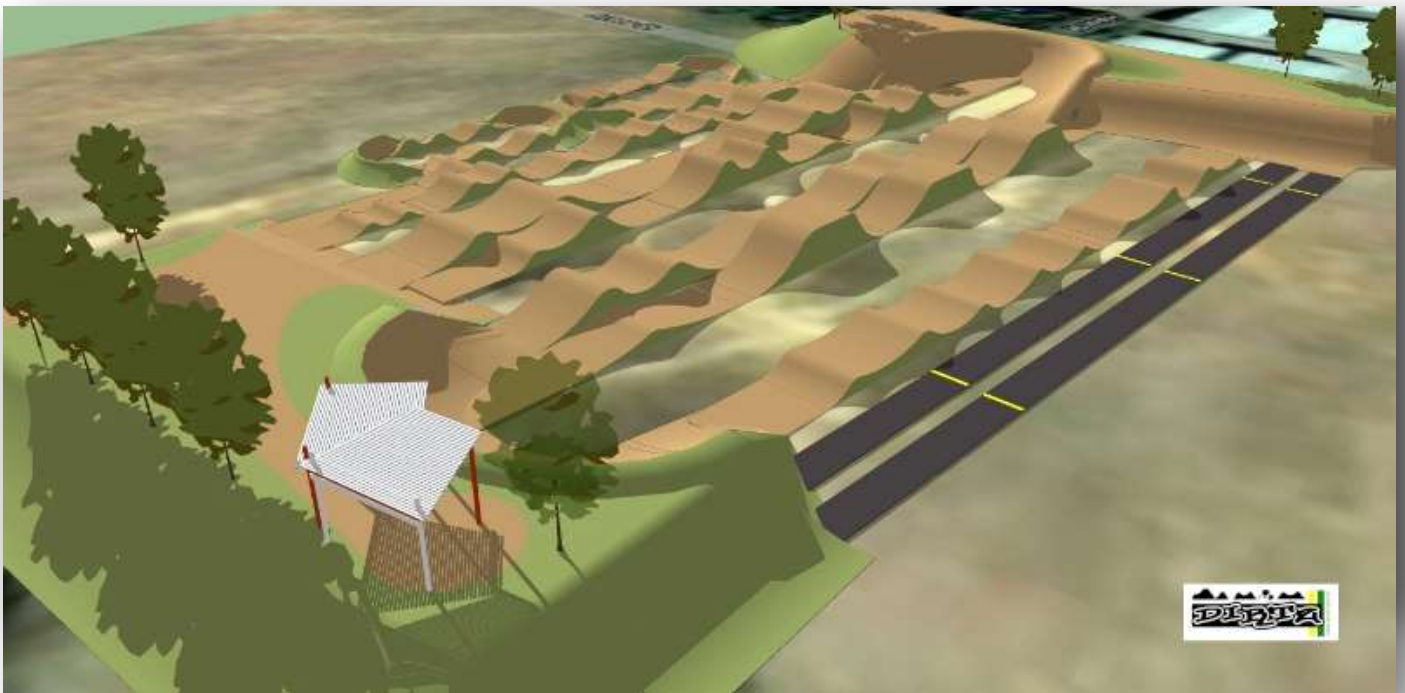

### Railway Terrace Landscaping

Residents and visitors to town have been very complimentary about the 'new look' of the railway reserve that has been revegetated. The partnership of Noel Boulden, council staff and Wheatbelt Workcamp, with some financial assistance from the OP Shop has attained a very pleasing result; a number of people have been spotted enjoying the walk.

Following the completion of the Department of Water funded project to direct more of the town storm water into the dam North of the CBH the shire will be applying for funding to continue the walk along the reserve. The works to the west of the pump house to redirect the water for the DoW project are still being designed but the project is due for completion by June 2016.



### Tip Shop

The Tip Shop is now open. This project supports the existing Lions Club Recycling project, the community Op Shop and Goomalling Buy and Sell (commercial business) and their aspirations of less to landfill.

It's been a busy year for the Goomalling Ladies Hockey Club! With the assistance of the Shire of Goomalling and the Wheatbelt Workcamp, the hockey club raised enough funds to replace our tired old shed and built a larger shed with extra storage for both the hockey and cricket clubs. The shed now provides shelter for two teams and spectators as well as storage for stick bags and more!

The next stage is to upgrade the hockey field. Over the years the existing Couch grass has been taken over and has created an uneven playing surface. For those who play hockey, we all understand the importance of having a flat field! The hockey club took it upon themselves to commence investigations into the replacement of the field and again, raise some much needed funds to see the project through. The Shire of Goomalling has allocated funds to help commence the project and together, have enough funds to commence the replacement at the end of the 2015 hockey season. The final stage of the field upgrades is to terrace the front of the new shed and install a water tank.

## JENNA PROGRESS ASSOCIATION

The Jennacubbine Progress Association (JPA) have been working on putting signage up at historical sights within the district of Jennacubbine (Jenna). At present, three signs about the Jenna Railway, Fettle Houses and a map of the Jenna Railway Site are being processed by Signcode.

The signs are A4 sized anodic printing on aluminium panels sponsored by the Goomalling & Districts **Community Bank**® Branch of Bendigo Bank.

We have signs for the Jenna School site, St Isodore's Church and Mumberkine Hall too and we will have a busy bee to install them all once our Railway signs are completed. We have also installed a sign at the CWA Rooms.

The JPA's purpose is "to protect the rich, local history of the Jennacubbine district and to promote the community in such a way that its history and character is not lost."

## LOCAL ROADS REPORT

Works crew will be carrying out two (2) major road projects for completion at the end of the calendar year.

Roads to Recovery - Yarramony Road  
Black Spot Funding - Berring Road

In February 2015 works will continue on Bejoording Road to widen the sealed section to 7m for a further 1.1kms funded by Local Roads Funding.

## THROSSELL STREET REJUVENATION

In addition to existing plans to vegetate the fence and solutions for rubbish disposal Council staff is investigating opportunities to develop 75 Throssell Street (Cnr Eaton) to a Nature Playground including artwork to increase the aesthetic appearance of the entrance into town.

# Community Development

## Native Reserve Project

## Goomalling – Perth Feeder Service via AvonLink



The Shire of Goomalling has been applauded by Hon Mia Davies MLA and Tim Woolerson (TRANSWA) for supporting a new service for the

residents of Goomalling.

TRANSWA and WDC approached Wheatbelt Shires in proximity to Northam and Toodyay, including Goomalling, with the aim of providing a support service for the Avon Link Train Service.

Goomalling Council recognised that this as a great opportunity to not only support the AvonLink Service but also provide our community greater flexibility to access the services of the metropolitan area.

The objective of TRANSWA and WDC is to increase the patronage of the AvonLink Service validating the petition form Toodyay and Northam residents to ensure the service continues.

Along with residents who don't have access to a vehicle or find driving in the metropolitan area a bit of a chore the other important demographic we see benefiting from this is our youth. Having access to some form of public transport gives the youth some independence. Greater opportunities to socialise with friends made at school in Northam, go to the movies, attend youth activities at Headspace in Midland and access the great events in Perth Cultural Precinct. (State Library, Museum, Art Gallery and public open space.)

## Youth Precinct & Community Park

### BMX Track

Brett Barnes, Dirtz Trackz is in the process of developing plans for the BMX Pocket Park, he held a consultation with local youth and determined a recreational park is most suitable for our community. Plans should be finalised in the coming weeks and construction is expected to commence September/October 2015.

### Skatepark

Planning of the skate park has been temporary put on hold whilst the BMX track is being constructed, one completed Council staff will continue the processes with Convic to develop a competition park that is useable for all experience levels.

### Youth Centre

Draft planning has taken place for the new youth centre utilising sea containers to form part of the complex, the initial planning requires adjustments and structural advice before plans will be released for public viewing. The specific location for the centre on the block will be determined once the BMX track is completed.

### Visitors & Cultural Centre

Expansion of the greater recreation ground has presented the opportunity to build on our economy and create more job opportunities by incorporating a culture/visitor centre with the youth centre, sharing facilities and skills sets to build capacity and employment prospects in the youth.

Objectives of the centre are to build and support the tourism industry in Goomalling and the region and create more opportunities to develop and promote local products and businesses. It is an opportunity to share will locals and visitors our history and what makes Goomalling today!

Council staff, Councillors and members of the Goomal Yarning Group visited Kodja Place in Kojonup a brilliant facility which was a great model for ideas.

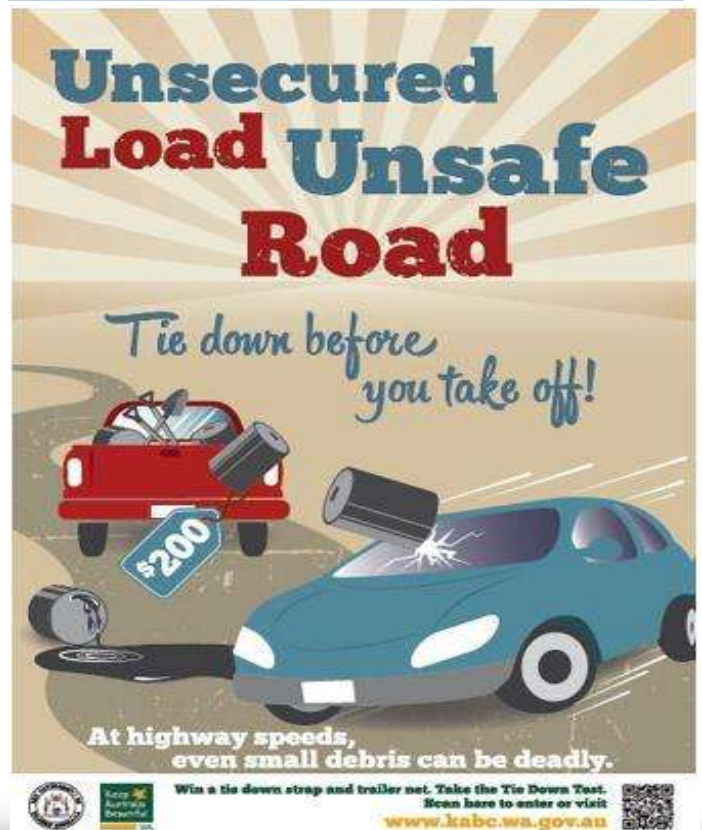

# St John Ambulance

## Local ambulance donated AED to Shire of Goomalling



The Shire of Goomalling gratefully accepted the recent donation of an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) from Goomalling's local ambulance service. Claire Dadd, President of the Goomalling St John Ambulance Sub Centre, made the presentation during the August Council meeting, and was pleased to note the Councillors' interest in the workings and importance of the device.

The AED, which will be located at the Shire office, has been registered as part of the St John Ambulance Community First Responder program.

This program creates a direct link between the St John Ambulance '000' call centre and local communities and organisations. The direct link enables individuals to provide immediate assistance to cardiac arrest victims in the time-critical period before an ambulance arrives – when it matters most. It is known that anyone can suffer sudden cardiac arrest - regardless of age, gender or health status. Approximately 33,000 Australians die from this condition every year.

The single key factor to improving survival rates of sudden cardiac arrest victims is the time taken to administer early CPR and defibrillation. Studies have shown dramatic improvements in survival rates where CPR and defibrillation are administered within five minutes of an event.

The Community First Responder procedure works as follows:

1. A person suffers sudden cardiac arrest.
2. Bystanders call 000.
3. An ambulance is dispatched.
4. The First Responder is called by the 000 call centre and sent to assist.
5. The First Responder carries out CPR and applies the AED if necessary.
6. The ambulance arrives and officers take over care of the patient.

Towns throughout Western Australia have wholeheartedly adopted the introduction of locally-based AEDs, with Goomalling being one of the leaders in the number of AEDs in the community. *In addition to the Shire location, AEDs can be found at the Caravan Park, the football pavilion, the tennis club, golf club and Farmer's Club. An AED is also situated at the local supermarket.*

Future plans include installing a 24 hour access AED in the centre of town. In order that First Responders and other community members are familiar with AEDs and the skills required for CPR, first aid classes are offered regularly by the Goomalling sub centre. Mrs Dadd will be giving a demonstration on how to use an AED to Councillors and Shire staff on 19 September.

# Goomalling Yarns Launch

Wandju, niche Ballardong boodja, moort boodja...

**Welcome to our country, Ballardong country, family country...**



In 2015, CAN and the Shire of Goomalling ran a program to rediscover, record and celebrate the stories of the Aboriginal families who lived on the Goomalling Reserve and in local missions and bush camps.

Through oral history recordings, photo sharing, family history research and arts workshops more than eighty community members helped bring the past back to life.

The personal stories of twelve senior Noongar community members were recorded by award-winning oral historian Bill Bunbury and collated by former ABC sound engineer Jemma King into a poignant twenty minute radio documentary.

Having a sense of identity, pride and self-acceptance is the foundation for thriving young people therefore it was essential to include our indigenous young people in the project, accordingly we used these life stories to inspire the town's youth to record a hip hop music track in their honour. The song called *Turn Back Time* was created during a two day workshop at the Goomalling Community Centre under the guidance of hip hop artist Scott "MC Optamus" Griffiths.

Local young people also documented the history of the town through photography workshops delivered by Mary Parker and Nat Brunvos at significant cultural sites around Goomalling.

All photos produced and collected are preserved by senior community members in exquisite hand covered family albums and all oral history recordings have been donated to Battye Library.

A unique collection of photos capturing day to day life on the Goomalling Reserve was also unearthed through the project. The Mavis Walley collection made up of 360 photographs that were donated by Mavis' daughter, Dallas Phillips, to the State Library of WA and can now be accessed via the Storylines website.



In sharing these stories we hope that the broader community learns more about the cultural significance of Goomalling, and the Noongar stories of the region.



Saturday 8 August was a significant milestone for the local aboriginal people, as a community we celebrated the launch of “Goomalling Yarns” a formal acknowledgement of their existence in Goomalling’s history, displaying genuine appreciation for their culture and their contribution to our community.

It began with a moving welcome to country by Willie Ponton supported by Colin Whitman on digeridoo, a recount from Tracey De Grussa about the time of harsh government policies and Lesley Murphy’s yarn of a more positive future until Frankie & Maitland brought the house down with the live performance of the track *Turn Back Time*.

The event was attended by a contingent of CAN staff including managing director Pilar Kasat, Chair George Kingsley and government dignitaries including Hon Paul Brown MLC and Hon Darren West MLC, members for the Agricultural Region and special guest Hon John Day MLA Minister for Planning, Culture and the Arts.

## Help us make Goomalling more liveable.... for everyone!

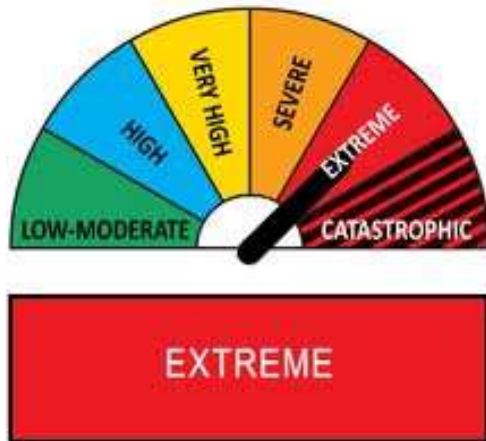
The Shire has been successful in obtaining funding from the Department of Local Government and Communities to engage a consultant to assist us to prepare an Age Friendly Community Plan.

We expect participation in this Focus Group will include about 10 hours in total (sessions of 2 to 3 hours over the period of a month, at this stage scheduled for November). We want this to be a comprehensive plan so all our seniors, their carers and service providers will be asked to complete a survey to guide the preparation of our plan. We expect the survey to be distributed in the coming weeks.

# Community Emergency Services

## Fire Season is fast approaching – now is the time to prepare.



Residents are advised to familiarise themselves with the requirements of the Shire's Fire Break Order, which sets out the legal responsibility of land holders and occupiers, and ensure that works are carried out accordingly. Copies of the order can be obtained via the Shire. All required measures must be in place by the 31<sup>st</sup> October 2015 and maintained until the 31<sup>st</sup> March 2016. Inspections are conducted and fines apply where the order is not complied to. Variations to the order may be applied for prior to the 15<sup>th</sup> October 2015.

In addition to Shire requirements there are many other measures you can take to help protect yourself and your family this fire season:

- Have a fire action plan and discuss it with your family.
- Ensure you have adequate and serviceable firefighting equipment.
- Do not use machinery or tools such as welders without standby firefighting equipment.
- Adhere to any Total Fire, Harvest, Vehicle and Hot Works Bans.

Residents are reminded that permits are required for burning from the 19<sup>th</sup> September 2015 (Restricted Burning Period) with the Prohibited Burning Period commencing on the 1<sup>st</sup> November 2015.

Finally, keep informed of bans by listening to ABC local radio or registering for the Shire's SMS service. To register for the SMS service, please contact the Shire.
