

From the CEO



It has been a great start to the cropping season and it is sincerely hope that the rains continue into September this year.

My previous several CEO reports have referred to the progress of the Koomal Village construction of the four (4) residences comprising 3 bedrooms and 1 ½ bathrooms

(consisting of 2 showers and 2 wcs). This project will be completed by the end of the Financial year 30 June 2018. It is very pleasing to report that the builders have scheduled the final inspection date as Friday 29th June 2018. As a result, the residences should be ready for occupancy in early August 2018.

Several people have expressed their interest by agreeing to pay the premium amount of \$285,000 with the minimum reimbursement of \$185,250 after the (10) or more years of occupancy.

Ratepayers & Debtors

Please ensure you use the appropriate reference on internet banking transfers to ensure your payment is allocated correctly. This is either the **Debtor Code** or **Rates Assessment Number**, both are located on the top right hand corner of the invoices/notices.

If you are struggling to meet your payment obligations with Council, please contact finance staff to make a payment arrangement that is realistic for your circumstances and minimises your stress. No communication suggests you're not going to pay therefore Council must take the necessary process to recoup the funds which may result in debt collection.

Kristina spoke of her challenges, living without regret and how **taking a chance**, **despite the odds**changed "her game"; highlighting that is okay to ask for help "When people know

your barriers, they are willing to help" said Kristina Perrin, U61 Australia & Oceania Champion.

The night concluded perfectly with a community gathering, everyone coming together to dance and be seduced by the charisma of Daren Reid & the Soul City Groove.
















Opshop news

Knick Knacks recently donated some fabric to make Goomalling Boomerang Bags. These bags have been made to help reduce plastic waste. Collect your personalised Goomalling bag from the Opshop or the Shire.

A monetary donation of \$500 went to Goomalling Primary School to put towards two reading comprehension box resources, to improve reading skills of middle and upper school students.

We have also been keeping busy by making fiddle blankets to help with dementia. These are made out of left over buttons & zips from clothes that are then used for rags.

New Child Care Subsidy

From 2 July 2018 a new Child Care Subsidy (CCS) structure will come into effect which aims to make childcare "more affordable for more families".

The eligibility criteria are changing slightly making subsidised care available to a broader population than just 'the working mothers'.

The current two-part structure of CCB and CCR will be replaced by one CCS which will be:

- Means tested the lower your income, the higher your subsidy (up to 85%), i.e. the lower your fee will be.
- Activity tested the more activity hours you
 do, the more hours of subsidised care you
 receive. "Activity" = paid work, unpaid work
 (volunteering), study/training, actively
 looking for work. Minimum has been reduced
 to 8 hours per fortnight.

With those changes just around the corner we want to take the opportunity to highlight what Goomalling's fantastic childcare centre – or Early Learning Centre as it is now known – has to offer.

At Goomalling Gumnuts our mission is to provide a nurturing and supportive environment to build positive relationships that allow children to grow into confident, creative individuals through play based learning.

At our most recent assessment in 2017 our ELC received the highest rating level of "Exceeding National Standards" which is an incredible achievement and is huge credit to our outstanding team of experienced, passionate and caring educators.

They complement parents' role in nurturing our children, modelling desired behaviour, teaching through positive guidance and lovingly encouraging them to express their individuality.

Our days consist of outdoor physical activities, music sessions, story time, craft sessions and language sessions which are structured around our weekly, themed programming and intentional learning strategies.

Gumnuts also offers after school care and school holiday program that is tailored to the older children (up to 12yo) that still regularly attend.





Boomerang Bags is a community driven initiative tackling plastic pollution at the grassroots level.

Dedicated volunteers, schools and community groups get together to make re-useable bags using recycled materials as a means to provide a sustainable alternative to plastic bags.


