Community Development update

Council awarded for commitment to youth

The Children's Environment and Health Local Government Policy Awards is an initiative developed by the Public Health Advocacy Institute of Western Australia (PHAIWA) in response to children's environment and health being identified as the highest priority in the 2009 forum.

The annual Local Government Report Cards have proven to be effective in evaluating program quality, promoting program improvement and informing and advocating for programs in many settings including schools, urban planning and health services. This project employs the report card as an innovative advocacy tool that acts as both an effective evaluation mechanism of local



government corporate strategy and an instrument to promote positive change in the local government sector.¹

Shire of Goomalling was recognised in the 2018 Children's Environment and Health Local Government Policy Awards ceremony held at the WALGA Local Government Convention, winning the category "Young People Making a Difference in Communities" for the second consecutive year.

Council's application showcased the successful youth event #GoomaTownFest in April this year, the PHAIWA panel said: "The Shire shows great commitment to its youth, offering several events per year which is highly commendable given its acknowledged lack of resources, The Hunger Maze was an original, creative event guided by consultation with young people, using community champions to give hope and to show that it is possible to reshape your future. The Young Legend Award was an excellent strategy to inspire others to be kind, contribute to their community and to aim high!"

Orchid hotspot Konnongorring

Konnongorring recreation reserve is a known orchid hotspot, and the abundant winter has created the perfect environment for a flourishing orchid season.

Decaying remnant trees are the birthing ground for the delicate blooms, with Ant Orchids (Caladenia roei), Donkey Orchids (Diuris sp), Spider Orchid (Calendia) and Sun Orchid (Thelymitra petrohila) scattered across the bushland floor amongst vibrant wattles and gums.

Please take care whilst searching for orchids because they are extremely delicate and heavy foot traffic destroys the soil bed.

Take only pictures, leave only footprints.

Bushfire Advisory Committee Meeting



Farmer Bushfire Response Vehicle stickers



Farm firefighting units form an important part of the Shire's overall bushfire response. To assist authorities in identifying vehicles which can assist DFES in bushfire response, DFES and the Shire encourage owners of such vehicles or machinery to apply for a Fire Response Vehicle Identifier windscreen sticker.

During bushfire events the Shire works with Police and Main Roads to manage or restrict traffic into affected

areas. The presence of a Vehicle Identifier Sticker will help in quickly identifying vehicles and machinery which may be permitted on the fire ground. Eligible vehicles include farm firefighting appliances, bulk water trucks and earth moving machinery. Application forms are available from the Shire Administration Centre or Shire website. Please note that previously issued stickers expire on the 30 September 2018, holders of these stickers have been contacted via mail with renewal process.

Delay of commencement Restricted Burning Period

Please be advised that the Shire of Goomalling has delayed the commencement of the Restricted Burning Period by 14 days, to **Wednesday 3 October 2018**. Permits to burn are required from this date onwards until 31 October.

Will You Be Bushfire Ready?

With winter now behind us, the Shire urges all residents to ensure that their properties and families are prepared for bush fire season.

All residents should be assessing their properties and ensuring that they comply with the requirements of Shire of Goomalling <u>Firebreak Order</u> – this was recently sent with rate notices to property owners and is also available on the Shire's website.

Now is also a good time to ensure that all firefighting equipment and vehicles are fully serviceable. This includes pumps, fuels, hoses and fittings.

The Shire also encourages all residents to have a bushfire plan and that all family members are aware of the plan. For further information on being prepared and staying informed in the event of an emergency go to

Road train permits

CLASS 2, 3 & 4 NETWORK ROAD TRAINS TRAVERSING ON LOCAL ROADS REQUIRE PERMIT FROM COUNCIL

It has come to our attention that a number of pocket road train owners are traversing within the Shire without a current Council endorsed permit. If you hold a Main Roads WA permit you are still required to obtain a permit from Council to traverse on *local roads*.

Please be advised that the \$13.20 Administration Charge (including GST) per Pocket Road Train configuration is required to validate your permit each year and that permission will be granted on an annual basis.

Permits will not be valid unless a receipt for the appropriate amount is attached.

Should you wish to renew your permit or apply for a new permit, please apply in writing advising of all Prime Mover and Trailer Registrations, along with \$11.00 per configuration. Your permit will be valid from date of receipt of the application until the same date the following year.

Implications to consider for non-compliance

- It may implicate insurance pay out of claims on vehicle without a valid permit
- It may implicate Main Roads Heavy Vehicle Permit
