Bike plan


The Shire has a town bike plan which was adopted in 2009. This plan outlines the missing links, works required and current footpath network in Goomalling. This plan has guided the shire with the footpath upgrades and its time we renewed the plan. The Department of Transport has grants for up to \$10,000 for strategic planning to which the Shire of Goomalling was successful in obtaining the grant for 2017/2018.



The Shire of Goomalling will work with the Department of Transport to complete the plan by December 2017, ready to apply for grant funding to complete the required works in 2018.

Reticulation & Hockey oval upgrade

Goomalling Recreation Ground irrigation upgrade encompasses the installation of automated irrigation system including the hockey field and football/cricket oval with a centralised computer system for management and monitoring both on and offsite.

Secondary component of the project includes the laser levelling and re-turfing of the hockey oval to create a more level playing surface and eliminate obstructions created from multiple species of grass. The surface will be replaced with a hybrid species that can withstand the local climate and provide a safer playing surface.

The Shire of Goomalling has submitted a grant application to the Department of Sport and Recreation to help cover the cost of the irrigation installation and levelling and returfing the hockey oval. If the Shire is successful, we aim to commence the project after the Mortlock Football finals in September.

Community Development update

Youth Friendly Community Plan

Department of Local Government and Communities funded the Our Youth, Our Future project which took just over seven months to complete.

The youth friendly community grant program enabled Council to engage young people in ways that were relatable to them. Council hosted four (4) events created by youth for youth in an effort to collect data to develop an achievable action plan.

The plan was officially launched on Thursday 9 March.

Young people created a community dispatch video which has a clips of young people voicing their opinion as well as a summary of the plan.


Department of Water granted Shire of Goomalling \$100,000 to complete a new dam and chlorination system to catch water runoff from the Goomalling town site, which is then shandied with effluent and pumped through the chlorination system to water the recreation ovals.

The new White Street dam which holds 1 ML has been pumped out 4 times, all that water would've escaped into Mortlock River catchment area. In addition to the higher than ordinary rainfall the water supply as a result of the redefinition of the culverts between Railway Terrace and White Street has increased significantly. The primary White Street dam has been emptied 4 times as well.


Economically the project employed local contractors to supply and install dam fencing, chlorinator fencing, dam construction, electrical, materials and engineering injecting \$99,040.92 into our local/regional businesses.

Asset Prioritisation

Council wants to create a community that has a diverse range of services and facilities for everyone LONG TERM. Collocation and asset prioritisation is a necessary process to ensure sustainable management and continuity of facilities indefinitely.

Council owns a significant number of residential, commercial and community properties and facilities, at current Council *should* be budgeting \$747,965 for BUILDING maintenance alone. This calculation is based on 1-3% of the replacement value in accordance with Local Government Financial Management Regulations and Australian accounting standards and does not include other infrastructure such as roads, sewerage, drainage, lighting, bins, tanks, plant, equipment or the swimming pool.

Councils need to prioritise expenditure to ensure financial sustainability. Community facilities are NOT used to their full capacity. Collocation and shared facilities is the way of the future.

Council will be talking to community groups over the coming months about the future needs of their groups and prioritising facilities. Keep an eye out for the community consultation regarding the asset prioritisation before the 2017/18 budget is finalised.

Youth precinct

In line the asset prioritisation constructing a new building is no longer a viable option for Council, therefore improving existing infrastructure to accommodate youth services is our approach. Council still intends to offer the same outcomes as the original plan including skate park, parkour, basketball, community garden playground etc.

Community garden

Like the youth precinct the community garden has been delayed due to Councils review of priorities, funding uncertainty and project workload. Councils grant monies of \$19,000 from Department of Local Government and Communities requires completion by 30 June 2017 therefore there is going to be a short window for community consultation, planning and action.

We will be advertising a workshop and garden planning very soon, so keep an eye out!

However, they will be located adjacent to the Memorial Town Hall to make use of the underutilised facility and improve the quality of the building for other users.

Community consultation will be carried out in the coming months in order for works to be carried out in 2017/18.

Velvet Pear Cactus Eradication Project

The key learnings for our project to date are:

- Ongoing need for surveillance of germinant post mechanical and other control. Seedling monitoring also needs to be extend more broadly beyond areas that have had control, as we know there will be a soil seed store of this specie in our project area.
- The use of a disposal pit is helpful, however we believe to minimise the potential of Opuntia spread through pad / fruit and drop in transport, we think in-situ control should always be the preferred option. After digging the pit and placing Opuntia material in it, we have had significant rain and the following issues will need to be rectified:
- allow water in the pit to drain into a contained area (small trench away from the pit)
- we need to progressively fill the pit from one end and back fill with soil as we go. Some of the material placed in the pit in the beginning has since reshot and we cannot at present control these until the water has drained off, if we are to use chemical control. In this instance we will probably locate all the plant material to one end of the pit and backfill it which does not required the pit to be dry before we do so.

Initial results suggest that more direct chemical applications such as basal barking and stem injection achieve quick and effective results. Our trial has not


been established long enough or possibly with enough replicates to be definitive about this point, however we anecdotal see that we are achieving mortality via these two methods.

State NRM supports the Velvet Pear Eradication project with a second grant of \$20,452 to assist Council to to remove the wide spread weed.

Council has employed a new project officer to carry out field work following the resignation of Jodi Iles. Jean Walker who was a full time Landcare Officer for the Shire of Bruce Rock and is enthusicatic about the task will continue to progress the project.



Community Emergency Services Manager Update

Farmer Bushfire Response Vehicle Identifier Stickers

Farm firefighting units form an important part of the Shire's overall bushfire response.

To assist authorities, identify vehicles which can assist DFES in bushfire response, DFES and the Shire encourage owners of such vehicles or machinery to apply for a Fire Response Vehicle Identifier windscreen sticker.

During bushfire events the Shire works with Police and Main Roads to manage or restrict traffic into affected areas. The presence of a Vehicle Identifier Sticker will help in quickly identifying vehicles and machinery which may be permitted on the fire ground.

Eligible vehicles include farm firefighting appliances, bulk water trucks and earth moving machinery.

Korean strain (K5) of Rabbit Haemorrhagic Disease Virus (RHDV)

RHDV2

RHDV2 does not pose a risk to human health and is not a modifiable livestock disease. However, the impact on pet rabbits and rabbit farms is high and it can cause death in young kittens (3-4 weeks) and a proportion of vaccinated adults. This new virus strain is distinct from RHD V1, which was released in Australia in 1996 for the control of wild rabbits. It affects rabbits and hares only.

RHDV2 was first reported in France in 2010 and has been found in several other European countries. It was first detected in Australia in the Canberra area in May 2015.

Clinical signs of RHDV2 differ from the type 1 virus. RHDV2 affects kittens at a younger age (from 3-4 weeks) and clinical signs may be over 3-5 days before death. This is significant in general practice where unwell rabbits may present for vague clinical signs including; lethargy, in appetence, pyrexia and gut stasis. These rabbits will be infectious to other rabbits.

The current vaccine for rabbit calcivirus (Cylap RCD) is not fully protective against RHDV2. However, there is evidence of some cross protection between type 1 and type 2 viruses. Keeping domestic or pet rabbits' vaccinations up to date is recommended to provide the maximum possible protection against this new strain. While an updated vaccine has been developed in Europe it is not currently available in Australia.

Until a specific vaccine is available for RHDV2, a revised vaccination protocol using the vaccine currently available in Australia has been suggested, though it is not known to what extent this will confer protection.

The virus is being distributed in March 2017 and nearby release sites are, Goomalling, Koorda, Wongan Hills, Dalwallinu and Toodyay.
