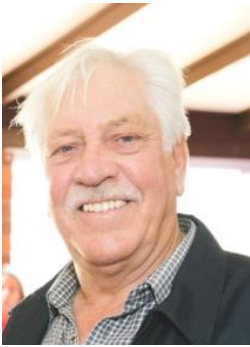
Goomalling District Plates

Are You Bushfire Ready?

With the amount of recent rain it's easy to overlook the fact that fire season is nearly upon us. Good winter rains have brought welcome good growth to crops, pastures and less welcome, weeds. All will present a heightened fire risk as the seasons change and drying and curing begins. Thus it's important that you start preparing your property for the fire season to give you, your family and property the best chance in the event of a bush fire. As a minimum all properties must be prepared to the standard set out in the Shire of Goomalling [Fire Break Order 2016-2017](#). The order sets out requirements such as establishment and maintenance of fire break and fuel reduction measures. Inspections are carried out and penalties apply for non-compliance.

Now is also a good time to ensure that your Bushfire Survival is up to date and understood by all family members. Residents are also advised to check and service any fire fighting equipment, such as pumps, hoses, branches, protective clothing and water supplies prior to the fire season.

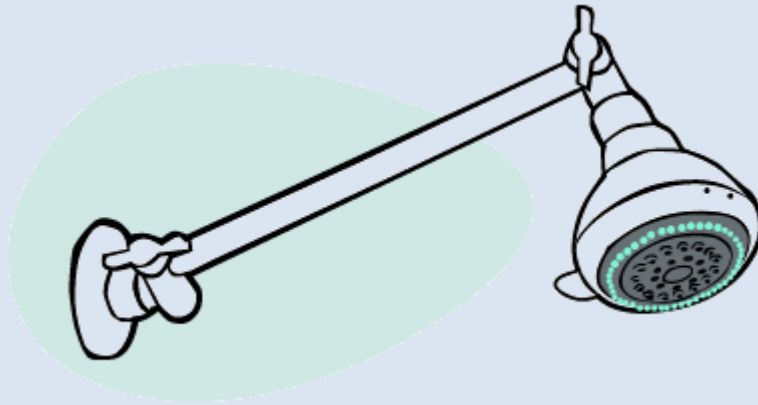

During the Fire Season the Shire may declare Harvest, Vehicle Movement and Hot Works bans. The Shire offers a free SMS service – please contact the Shire to be added to this service. Additionally the Department of Fire and Emergency Services may declare Total Fire Bans under which it is illegal anything which may start a fire. Further information on Total Fire Bans is available on the DFES website (dfes.wa.gov.au).

Once the works on Konnongorring West road is complete, it is programmed to commence works on Beejording road.

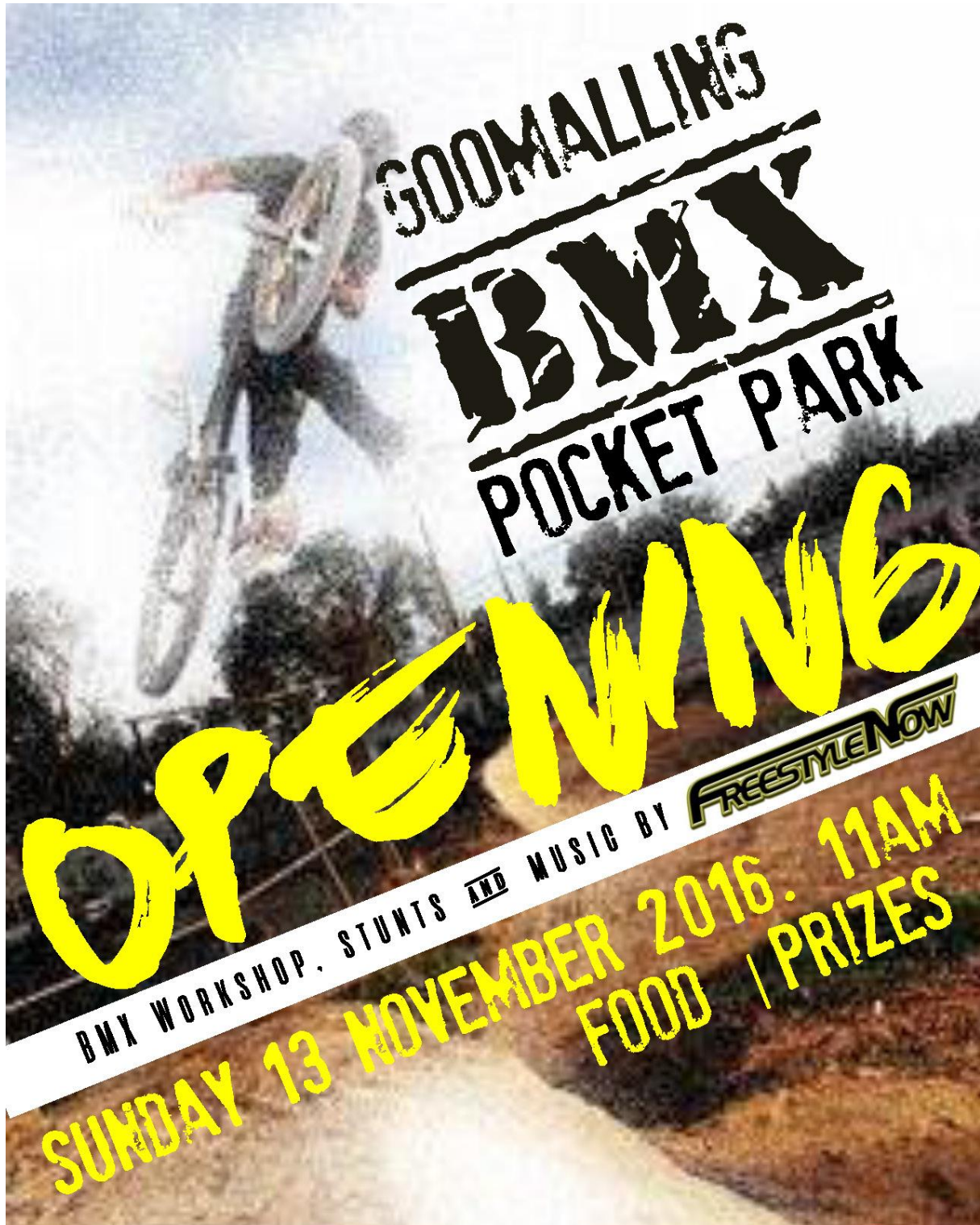
Council resolved at its May meeting to pay gravel royalties of \$3.00 per metre.

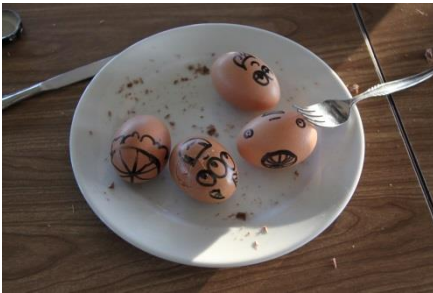
Jakob Boase was awarded for his aptitude in the spelling challenge, being the only participant to spell all five (5) words correctly.

UWA Consultation

Council through Wheatbelt Development Commission engaged four (4) students from UWA with an aim to:

1. Give students' exposure to the Wheatbelt and an understanding of the opportunities this region offers.
2. To enable students to have real connection with members of rural communities.
3. To give students an opportunity to work on real community priorities.
4. To define projects that will give the students an opportunity to be creative. This may mean that some are not practical in the short-term or under current conditions but may provide ideas for the future.
5. To develop an amount of information about the Wheatbelt at University level that can be used to encourage further study of this region.

Students were given a scoping document that identified three (3) priority issues including youth

issues, town site drainage, town aesthetics and green spaces.

The potential themes for the project:

- ❖ Youth engagement;
- ❖ Developing employment pathways;
- ❖ Indigenous history and culture engagement;
- ❖ Town planning, including drainage and road upgrades;
- ❖ Design for a youth focused hands-on workshop, including the electrical requirements;
- ❖ Green space and pedestrian access development, and beautification; and
- ❖ Community connectivity, in particular the linkages between the town centre, youth space and recreational facilities.

Youth Precinct

Wheatbelt Development Commission's Wheatbelt Regional Grant Scheme Fund announcement saw Goomalling as one (1) of only seven (7) successful applications totally \$1.58 million dollars.

"The Wheatbelt Development Commission congratulates all successful recipients for their thoroughness in development and submitting high impact project proposals. It was an incredibly competitive round."¹

Shire of Goomalling secured \$269,000 for the development of a youth drop-in-centre; the business case encapsulated the youth precinct development and the significant lack of youth services in Goomalling and the Wheatbelt. The project aims to deliver a facility that will provide a safe, equitable environment for youth to develop.



Once again the Royalties for Region initiative is delivering money back to our community that will enhance social environment for our young people.

Hon Mia Davies Minister for Sport & Recreation, Water and local member for Wheatbelt presented the Shire of Goomalling with a certificate and congratulations on submitting a compelling project proposal (pictured onsite at the first stage of the development—BMX Pocket park).

We are now waiting on the results of our National Stronger Regions Fund (NSRF) and Lotterywest applications. The youth centre project will delay the community garden slightly as the garden will need to be constructed after the youth centre. Further information will be disseminated shortly.

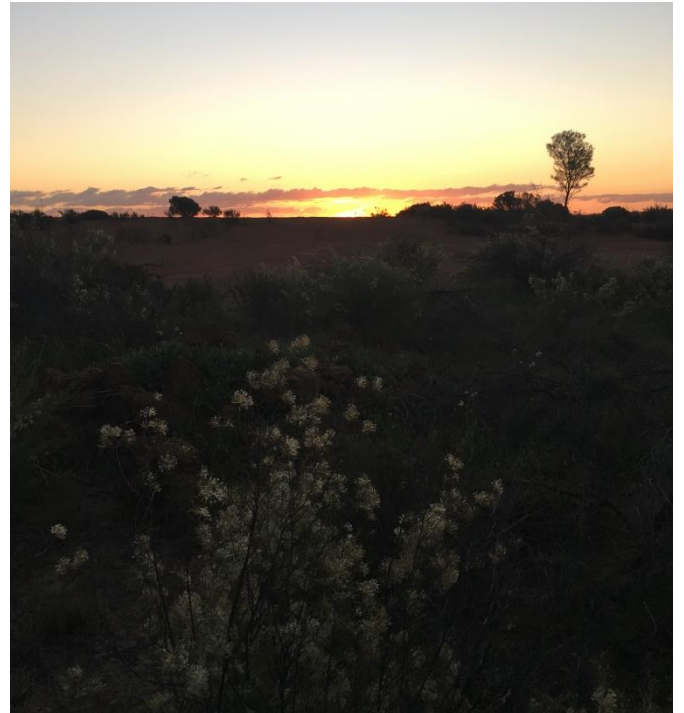
Spring is promise of renewal after winter reflection. The scent of fresh blooms and green grasses tickle your nose and bring about an invigorated spirit.

Congratulations to the gym ladies for raising in excess of \$3000.00 towards the upgraded equipment. Thank you to Goomalling & Districts **Community Bank**[®] who contributed \$3000.00 for a new treadmill, Greg Baird for donating his truck to pick up the new equipment, Goomalling Farmshed for loaning their forklift and once again Wheatbelt Workcamp who assisted to unload the equipment into the new gym.

The whole upgrade is valued at \$25,000.00 funded through sale of old equipment, fundraising and support from Goomalling & Districts **Community Bank**[®], including Councils contribution of \$17,000.00

Since opening Friday 19 August we have seen ten (42) new members take advantage of the 24/7 access.

Aged Friendly Communities

Mortlock Aged Housing Project

Royalties for Regions Country Local Government Fund – Pool Funding 2012/13

Shire of Toodyay is the administering body of the 2012/13 pool funding allocation which includes the development of four (4) new aged persons units in Goomalling. The process has been long and drawn out due to the Shire of Toodyay's units being built on land owned by Butterly Cottage which has required additional negotiations

We are hoping tender documents will be completed soon to get the construction underway.

Royalties for Regionals Country Local Government Fund – Competitive Funding 2018/19

Goomalling is the coordinating Council for the Mortlock Aged Housing Project, with the assistance of Wheatbelt Development Commission and Heartlands we have produced a business case to apply for competitive funding;

Our business case has been submitted to Department of Regional Development to build 22 units in the Shire's of Dowerin, Goomalling, Toodyay and Victoria Plains to meet the current and future demand for aged housing.

The business case is currently going through an external due diligence process before be submitted to cabinet for final assessment.

The funding is for the design and construction of platinum standard aged persons units with dementia friendly features. If approved the funding will be allocated in 2018/19 commencing in Goomalling with four (4) units and will continue for three (3) years until completed in Dowerin 2020/21.

Age Friendly Community Small Value Grant

Council received \$54,500 from Wheatbelt Development Commission Royalties for Regions funding for projects identified in the Aged Friendly Audit which was carried out by community members, Council staff and Localise Consultants.

The project aims to improve accessibility to community facilities and increase social participation. The following locations were identified as a priority:

1. Cemetery
2. Anstey Park
3. Senior Citizens Hall
4. CWA Toilets

5. Slater Homestead accessibility

The CWA toilet and Cemetery projects are now completed which concludes the upgrade.

Thank you to the Friends of the Cemetery Group and Dowerin Events Management who donated \$17,000 and \$2000 respectively, towards the upgrade of the Cemetery including new seating.

Once again our sincerest gratitude to Wheatbelt Work Camp who provided labour for the Cemetery, Anstey Park and Senior Citizen Halls projects.



Wheatbelt Heritage Rail Project

Tests are still taking place to ensure the rolling stock can safely traverse the main train line.

Project managers are working towards a timeline to have the S Class locomotive relocated to Dowerin in December 2016. There are no firm dates confirmed for passenger operation.

Once operational the anticipated schedule (variable) will see the steam train leave from Goomalling at 10.00am and return at approximately 5.00pm twice per month Saturday & Sunday subject to change (pending feasibility assessment).

This is a massive opportunity for local businesses to attract outside money to supplement local support. The tourist products that will be our selling point is quality overnight accommodation, breakfast/dinner patrons, local produce/markets, agriculture, culture, heritage and biodiversity.

Community groups could also benefit through fundraising stalls held in conjunction with the train operation

Avon Tourism Motorcycle Friendly Communities

Avon Tourism was successful in their application to the Wheatbelt Development Commission's Community Chest Fund supported by Royalties for Regions to develop the "motorcycle friendly communities' initiative".

This project will see the creation of an Avon Valley regional map which highlights motorcycle friendly venues (eateries/accommodation/attractions), fuel stops and rest stops along with information about local roads/network. Once complete the map will be published online, through social media and in a pocket size "z-card" brochure.

The seven (7) Avon Valley Shire's will be linked through entry and directional signage. The launch of the project will include a regional event and extensive advertising.

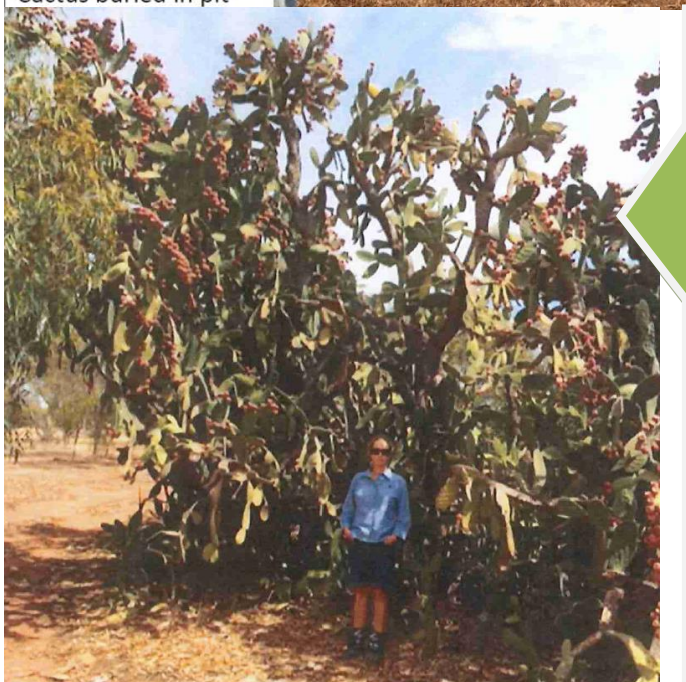
Cactus Infestation

Our biggest barrier is that people don't think it's a problem.

Opuntia tomentosa "Velvet Tree Pear" (Prickly Pear) is a declared noxious weed; It started as ONE plant in someone's garden and how now spread to the waterways. Department of Agriculture and Food WA (DAFWA), Greening Australia and Council have been working together to find sustainable solutions to eradicate the infestation. Funding applications to DAFWA and State NRM have been submitted for financial assistance to enable immediate action particularly on fruiting plants.

A trial/demonstration is taking place Friday 9 September to test stem injection on large plants in the hope it will be a more effective technique. Spraying plants of their size takes significant amount of chemical and time to actually kill the plant.

Please report any sightings of the cactus to Council staff (particularly on private property) so we can map their location and prepare an action plan.

- If a plant is located on your property contact the shire office to arrange its destruction or removal.

Water Harvesting Project

Dam and drain construction is complete thank you to AK Evans The pad for the chlorinator and tank is due for completion in the coming week (pending weather conditions), Aquasol will carry out their inspection of the site 22 September with installation to follow.

Department of Water inspected the project Wednesday 31 August and were happy with the outcomes.

It is amazing how much water we were losing from the town site runoff prior to the dam installation. The water has been transferred to the main reservoir three (3) times since completion.

The project is funded by Department of Water's Community Water Supply Program.
