






RESEALING WORKS – NORTHAM PITHARA RD & GOOMALLING TOODYAY RD (GOOMALLING TOWNSITE)

Fulton Hogan are conducting resealing works on behalf of MRWA on Goomalling Toodyay Rd and Northam Pithara Rd in Goomalling and will be working in and around Goomalling from Tuesday 10th March until Wednesday 18th March (pending program progress & favourable weather). There will be no works conducted from Friday 13th March – Sunday 15th March.

The work involves full width bitumen resealing of Goomalling Toodyay Rd (10th & 11th) from Railway Terrace to Lockyer St and Northam Pithara Rd (11th - 12th & 16th - 18th) from Salmon Gum Way to Goomalling Calingiri Rd. Works will commence from 7am – 5pm, with stop/slow traffic control and utilise a bitumen sprayer, aggregate spreaders, suction sweepers and rollers. No excavation or vibration will be undertaken during the works. Residents and businesses will have access at all times during the works and we expect the works to be completed by 5pm Wednesday 18th March.





Effective rinsing guide

**1**

Fill the drum to approximately 20 to 25 percent of its capacity with clean water. The amount must be sufficient to coat all interior surfaces during rinsing.

**2**

Secure the cap and shake or roll the drum thoroughly for at least 30 seconds. This action ensures that the rinse water makes contact with all internal surfaces.

**3**

Pour the rinsate into a spray tank or apply it to a paddock in accordance with the original product label's directions - allow the drum to drain for 30 seconds.

**4**

Repeat steps 1 through 3 two more times, for a total of three rinses. If residue is still visible after the third rinse, additional rinsing must be performed until the drum is completely clean.

All eligible containers must be residue free and have this logo to be accepted for recycling

**5**

Clean the outside of the drum to remove any spills or drips that occurred during use.

**6**

Once clean, turn the drum upside down and leave to drain and dry fully in a clean, dry area. After drying, store the drum in a secure, covered place to prevent contamination until drop-off.

**7**

Remove caps and closures before drop-off. These items are made from incompatible plastics and cannot be recycled through drumMUSTER.

**8**

Take your clean drums to your nearest drumMUSTER collection site for recycling.

WA SHEEP INDUSTRY SUPPLY CHAIN CAPACITY INCREASED THROUGH GRANTS

The first round of the Supply Chain Capacity Program grants, valued at \$20 million, are set to flow to Western Australian sheep producers and processors to bolster capital investment and build productivity.

- Grants have been awarded under Round 1 of the Supply Chain Capacity Program
- Funding to support 45 sheep producers and processors to build on-farm finishing and processing capacity
- Second round of grants will open on 27 February 2026

The first round of the Supply Chain Capacity Program grants, valued at \$20 million, are set to flow to Western Australian sheep producers and processors to bolster capital investment and build productivity.

The program forms part of the Australian Government's \$139.8 million Sheep Industry Transition Assistance Package, which is designed to assist as businesses adjust to the phase out of live sheep exports by sea.

The Round 1 grants have been awarded to 40 producers to support investment into on-farm finishing systems and to five processors for capacity building, including lairage upgrades, cold storage enhancements, and abattoir expansion.

The successful projects span the Wheatbelt, South West, Great Southern, and Esperance-Goldfields regions.

Producer projects include strengthening production capacity and improving market readiness with new and upgraded feedlots, paddock finishing infrastructure, and other improvements designed to enhance supply chain reliability, strengthen flexibility, and support more consistent livestock supply to processors across the State.

The program, administered by the Rural Business Development Corporation on behalf of the Australian Government, aims to increase onshore processing supply chain capacity, efficiency, and productivity in Western Australia.

The gym is located at the recreation grounds in the old sports pavilion, on the corner of Quinlan & Hoddy Streets.




