# Introducing AusAlert™

In October 2026, the Australian Government is launching AusAlert – a new national warnings system that uses the latest technology to send emergency messages to compatible mobile devices.



## What is AusAlert?

AusAlert is a fast and reliable way to help communities be informed and better prepared during local and national emergencies.

## What is AusAlert for?

AusAlert gives the Australian Government and state and territory emergency services organisations the ability to send national or local alerts about disasters. These could be natural hazards such as bushfires, floods, cyclones and tsunamis, or events like public health emergencies, security threats or biosecurity incidents. It's just one of the many ways we're helping to keep Australians safer in times of disaster.

## How does AusAlert work?

AusAlert uses the latest technology to send near-instant emergency messages to compatible mobile devices during disasters.

## What are the different types of AusAlert?

There are 2 main types of AusAlert:

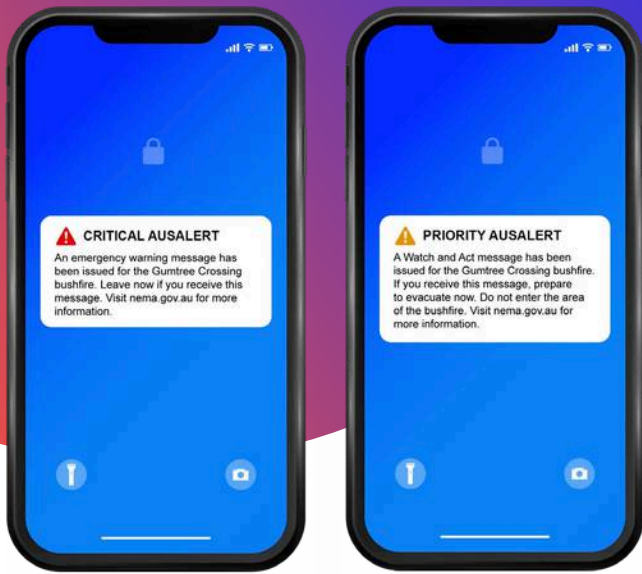
- **Critical Alerts** are used for the most serious emergencies. They can't be opted out of.
- **Priority Alerts** are used for emergencies where there is a heightened level of threat because conditions are changing. They can be opted out of.

## What will be included in an AusAlert?

An AusAlert will be written in English and will let you know the type of emergency, where it's located, how serious it is and how to respond. It will also tell you the name of the emergency organisation that has sent the AusAlert and where to find more information about the emergency.

## What does an AusAlert look like?

Depending on your device type and operating system, an AusAlert message will look something like this:



The AusAlert messages shown on screen are examples only and not real AusAlerts.

## What does an AusAlert sound like?

A **Critical Alert** will cause your mobile device to vibrate and will be delivered with a loud siren-like warning sound that lasts about 10 seconds. It will make this noise even if you've set your device to 'silent' or 'do not disturb' mode.

A **Priority Alert** may vibrate and include a siren-like warning sound, but exactly how it is delivered will depend on your settings, device type and operating system.

## Is an AusAlert a text message?

No, an AusAlert isn't an SMS or text message – it's an 'alert'. It will appear as a notification on your mobile device's screen and will show up during phone calls, app use, and on lock screens. You'll need to close the notification once you've seen the message, otherwise it will remain on your screen.

## What do I do if I receive an AusAlert?

You should read and understand the AusAlert and follow the instructions to keep yourself and others safe.

## Should I wait until I receive an AusAlert to act in an emergency?

It's important you don't wait to receive an AusAlert before acting in a disaster. You must still prepare yourself, have an action plan and be proactive. AusAlert is just one way to stay safe. Turn on local or national TV or radio, check emergency services apps, or search online for more information about the emergency.

## Will my mobile be able to receive an AusAlert?

Mobile devices such as compatible mobile phones and some tablets and smart watches will be able to receive an AusAlert message. AusAlerts are expected to work on iPhones 11 and up running iOS 26.4 or later and Android phones and tablets running Android 12 or later. Always install the latest software updates on your device when asked so you're ready to receive AusAlerts.

## What if I don't want to receive an AusAlert?

AusAlerts contain important information and should be turned on to help keep you safe. You can't opt out of a Critical Alert. The only way to not receive a Critical Alert is to turn your mobile device off or switch it to aeroplane mode. You can opt out of an AusAlert Priority Alert. ## What if I receive an AusAlert while driving?

If you receive an AusAlert while driving or riding, stay calm and don't touch your phone. Mobile phone laws remain active – don't read or respond to the alert while moving. The AusAlert may make a siren-like sound for about 10 seconds. Only check the message when it is safe and legal to do so.

# GO Circular - Be a Great Sort workshop series kicks off



Goomalling's commitment to waste reduction is off to a strong start this year, with the first GO Circular – Be A Great Sort Workshop, delivered in partnership with Urban Revolution, held on Thursday, 7 May. Five residents attended the inaugural session, showing high enthusiasm as they learned practical composting techniques and explored ways to reduce household waste.

The workshop marks the beginning of the Shire's annual Waste Sorted series, with most facilitators already confirmed and a small number finalising their schedules. The program aims to equip the community with hands-on skills that support long-term sustainable habits.

Local Businesses Join the Waste-Wise Effort, Lot 39 Store & Café will provide data on reusable cup use following the workshop delivery, Shire of Goomalling has purchased 100 Fressko Cups, which will be offered as incentives to workshop participants who embrace waste-wise behaviours. This partnership aims to strengthen community engagement and encourage residents to choose reusable options in their everyday routines.

New signage has been ordered for the Goomalling Refuse Site, establishing a clearly marked E-Waste drop-off point. This improvement will make it easier for residents to dispose of electronic waste responsibly and divert valuable materials away from landfill.

The Goomalling Op Shop is expanding its sustainability efforts by installing a sea container dedicated to collecting textile waste for delivery to PCCRW (Perth Community Clothing Recycling Wholesaler). New signage is also being developed to promote Great Sort messaging and highlight how donating to the Opshop contributes back to the community via the Activate Goomalling Program. The initiative aims to reduce the volume of clothing entering landfill while improving sorting behaviours.

Work is progressing on a new digital Waste & Recycling Guide for the AMP UP (AROC) Councils. This resource will provide consistent, accessible waste-education information across participating local governments, supporting long-term behaviour change and helping residents make informed decisions about waste sorting and disposal.

The Shire's early momentum in waste education, business partnerships, and infrastructure improvements reflects a growing community commitment to sustainability. With more workshops scheduled throughout the year, residents will have ongoing opportunities to learn, participate, and contribute to a cleaner, more resource-wise Goomalling.

The GO Circular – Be A Great Sort is possible thanks to funding through the Western Australian Government's WasteSorted Community Education Program.

## Fuel Support Payment available for valid driver licence holders from 1 July

From 1 July 2026, all eligible Western Australian driver's licence holders can apply for the Fuel Support Payment.

The State Government has announced the one-off \$100 payment as a cost-of-living measure in the 2026-27 State Budget to assist Western Australian drivers with fuel costs and other financial pressures.

All WA driver's licence, learner's permit, provisional and extraordinary licence holders can apply. People with a cancelled, suspended or expired WA driver's licence are not eligible to apply.

You can claim the Fuel Support Payment on the ServiceWA app from 1 July 2026. Visit the [ServiceWA app: Support hub](#) for help to set up your ServiceWA app ahead of time.

Alternative claim options will also be available for people who are unable or do not wish to use the app with information provided soon.

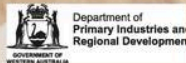
