Council launches new UserWay Accessibility feature to improve online inclusion

From 1 July 2026, Council has activated a major accessibility upgrade on its website with the introduction of the UserWay Accessibility Widget, a tool designed to make online information easier to access for all community members.

The UserWay feature provides a suite of customisable accessibility options, including adjustable text size, colour contrast controls, screen-reader support, keyboard navigation enhancements, and dyslexia-friendly settings. These tools help ensure that residents of all abilities can more easily engage with Council services, information, and digital resources.

Council CEO said the upgrade reflects Council's ongoing commitment to building an inclusive and accessible community.

"Every resident deserves equal access to information. Adding UserWay to our website is a practical step that strengthens digital inclusion and supports people with diverse needs."

The accessibility widget is now live on all Council webpages and can be activated via the accessibility icon located in the bottom corner of the site.

Council will continue to review and expand its digital accessibility initiatives to ensure the website remains compliant with evolving accessibility standards and best practice.

SHIRE OF GOOMALLING RECOGNISED AT WALGA LOCAL GOVERNMENT HONOURS AWARDS

Two of Goomalling's very own have been recognised at WALGA's Local Government Honour Awards held on Friday, 12 June 2026 at the WA Museum Boola Bardip.

Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Natalie Bird received the **Merit Award** in recognition of notable contributions and service to WALGA, Local Government and/or the Local Government sector.

Natalie began her career with the Shire in 1989, progressing from front counter and reception duties to senior management positions. Throughout her 37 years of continuous and exemplary service, Natalie has made a profound and lasting contribution to the Shire, ensuring organisational resilience and stability, while also driving enhanced service delivery.

A champion of the Goomalling community, Natalie has volunteered in community organisations for many years, working to strengthen local groups, support local economic development, and maintain vibrant sporting and social opportunities for residents. Her tireless efforts have helped safeguard vital services and ensured the long-term wellbeing and sustainability of the Goomalling community.

Ex Shire President, Barry Haywood received the **Eminent Service Award** in recognition of significant and distinguished participation and contribution to WALGA, Local Government and/or Local Government sector and demonstrated record of leadership and commitment to Local Government.

With more than two decades of service to the Goomalling community, Barry was elected to Council in 2023, serving as Deputy President in 2013, and elected Shire President from 2015 - 2023. Committed to Local Government, regional advocacy and community wellbeing, Barry remained on Council for two years after his retirement from the Shire President's role, to ensure a smooth transition for the incoming Shire President and to mentor new Councillors, helping to build community confidence, Elected Member capacity and strong governance within the Shire.



Throughout his 22 years of dedicated service to the Shire of Goomalling, Barry presided over major infrastructure projects, including establishing the Council-owned medical centre and securing services of a doctor for the Shire. He spearheaded the development of the Goomalling Sports and Community centre, was an active member of the Local Emergency Management Committee, and served for many years as a volunteer Bush Fire Control Officer.

Barry served as an inaugural member of the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network Steering Committee, which involved one of the regions's most significant collaborative freight projects. He was Chair of the Avon Regional Road Group, contributed to the Avon Regional Organisation of Council's, and was the Shire's delegate on the Avon Midland Country Zone.

A champion of local enterprise, Barry was involved in the steering committee that established the Bendigo Bank in Goomalling and contributed to both the Small Business Centre Committee and the Wheatbelt West Management Committee. A tireless local volunteer, Barry understood the critical importance of grassroots initiatives and community organisations in improving the quality of life for local residents.

New Equipment Enhances Training Options at the Goomalling Community Gym.

Shire of Goomalling awarded \$20,343 to upgrade ANPR camera as part of highly competitive State CCTV program

The Shire of Goomalling has been successful in securing \$20,343 through the Cook Labor Government's Closed -Circuit Television (CCTV) Election Commitment Grant Program, enabling the replacement of the Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) camera on the Railway Terrace tilt pole.

This year's program was highly competitive, attracting more than 300 applications from 70 local governments across Western Australia and only 35 local governments receiving a share of the \$1million allocation. Applications were assessed by the WA Police Operations Command Centre and the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulation and Safety. Successful projects were selected based on factors including local crime and antisocial behaviour trends, prioritisation of operational and technical considerations, opportunities for network development, and existing CCTV coverage in the area.



Goomalling's project was developed based on community safety need and strong collaboration with the Goomalling Police to identify priority surveillance locations. The funding forms part of the State Government's \$22.5 million 2025–26 community safety election commitment, aimed at reducing neighbourhood crime and antisocial behaviour through targeted CCTV investment.

Strengthening safety at a key entry point.

The upgraded ANPR camera will:

- Improve vehicle identification to support police investigations
- Enhance surveillance coverage along a major access route
- Maintain community confidence through visible safety infrastructure
- Support rapid incident response in and around the town centre

“Keeping Goomalling safe is a shared responsibility, and this funding helps us continue that work with confidence. The upgraded ANPR camera will give our community greater peace of mind and provide valuable support to local police. We appreciate the State Government's commitment to helping regional towns strengthen their safety infrastructure.” - Cr Julie Chester, Shire President



The Council acknowledged the State Government's support and emphasised the importance of modern CCTV technology in maintaining a safe and welcoming community.

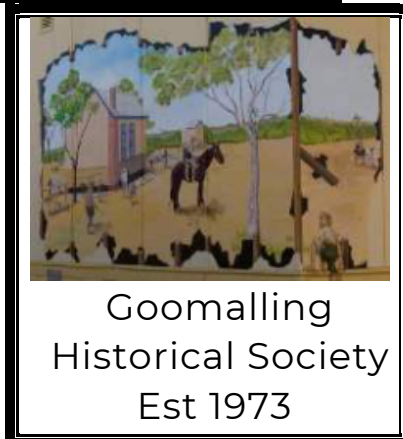
Goomalling Historical Society

50 year anniversary of the Goomalling Museum

The opening of the Goomalling Municipal Museum, in June 1976, was momentous for the society.

The museum was the Konnongorring school building, which closed in December 1973.

Konnongorring school was the last of the 16 small schools that had been dotted around the Goomalling district.



Prior to the school closure, the Historical Society commenced the process of trying to obtain the building for use as a museum. In mid 1974 the ownership of the school building was transferred to the Shire of Goomalling. The preparation, transportation, locating and rebuilding of the school is a credit to the Goomalling community, Shire of Goomalling and Historical society members.

Goomalling now had a museum to store the historical society collection and the Konnongorring school building was preserved as an example of isolated small rural schools.



The Goomalling Museum is located on Throssell Street, next to the pool and opposite Shell. The volunteers meet Tuesdays, at the museum, between 10.30am and 12 noon.

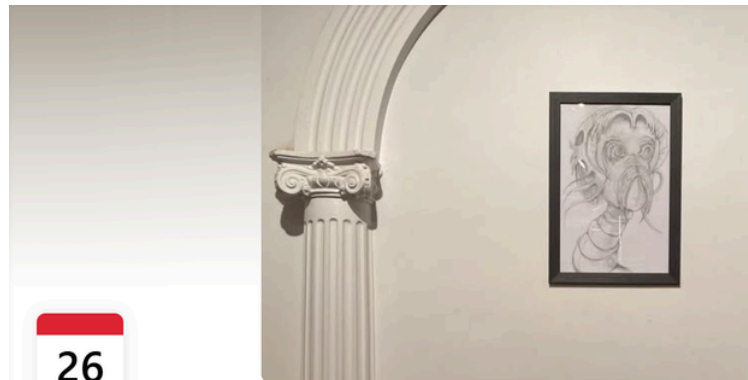

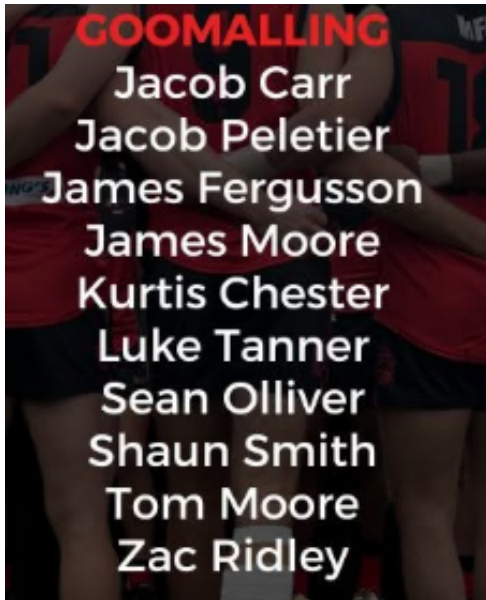
