## Jennacubbine Progress Association

### 2026 ANZAC SERVICE

On 25 April 2026, the War Memorial at Jennacubbine was surrounded in a pre-dawn fog. The Jennacubbine Progress Association (JPA) hosted a Dawn Service that was well attended by the community of Jennacubbine and people who travelled from afar.



The service was led by Danny Jeffery who welcomed everyone and mentioned in his address that ANZAC Day is not a day for the glorification of war. It is a day for memory of the original ANZACs of Gallipoli and those who have followed them in subsequent wars.

Clive Craddon gave a commemorative speech in which he talked about his time as a surveyor in Borneo, (having been transferred from Vietnam). In Borneo, he experienced an incidence where, as a 23-year-old man, he was very frightened when confronted by guerillas. He was about to be evacuated when he was left without protection from armed soldiers. Before the soldiers left, a soldier gave him a pistol for protection. Clive became aware of danger as 3 guerillas approached, and he took cover behind a tree. He came out as they passed and managed to get them to lay down their weapons without using the pistol. This happened just in time for him to be evacuated by the last helicopter.



A reading about the contribution of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander service in Australia's defence history was read by Cheryl Eaton. It entailed how their training and skills went unrecognised and unrewarded until 1992, where their service and bravery was formally recognised with medals and back pay.

'The Ode' read by Ellie Eaton and readings of the 'ANZAC Spirit Today' by Issy Leeming and Kacey Monaghan, represented how reverent and respectful each generation regards our ANZAC traditions.

Many thanks also to the JPA members; Danny Jeffery, Steve Lamb, John Broadhurst, Cheryl Eaton and her family, for volunteering their time in tidying and setting up the Jenna Hall and the War Memorial the day prior, and for cooking and assisting with the Gunfire breakfast. A special thank you to Steve and Brenda from Jenna Tavern for their assistance and offering to serve coffees.



We are very fortunate at Jennacubbine to have the WA 10<sup>th</sup> Lighthorse Organisation Avon Troop led by John Simmons. ANZAC Day Service 2026 was the first time for the Avon Troop to ride three horses at an event, and it was the first time for Hugo (named in honour of VC recipient, Captain Hugo Throssell). 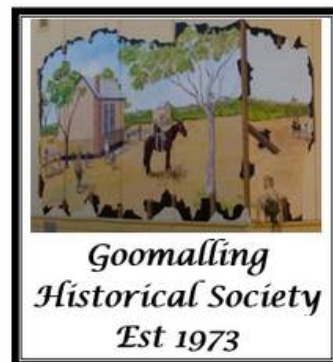

## ***Goomalling Historical Society***

***Fifty three years ago, in May 1973, the Goomalling Historical Society was formed.***

The minute book of the society states that a public meeting, convened by the Shire of Goomalling, was held on the 9th May 1973, and the motion to form the Goomalling branch of the Royal W.A. Historical Society was carried.

The Goomalling Historical Society office bearers comprised Barbara Sewell as president, Peggy Pryor as secretary and Garnet Royal as treasurer. The foundation committee were J.F. Schell, L.A. and F. Sewell, S. and K. Ingram, A. Bunney and C.L. Smith.



The society members believed in the need to preserve the past: documentation, historical sites and buildings. Meetings were held monthly and the society started collecting photographs and items of historical interest to the Goomalling area. They were also fundraising and searching for a location to house their collection of donated items.

The current members of the Goomalling Historical Society meet Tuesdays, at the museum, between 10.30am and 12 noon. The Goomalling Museum is located on Throssell Street, next to the pool and opposite Shell.



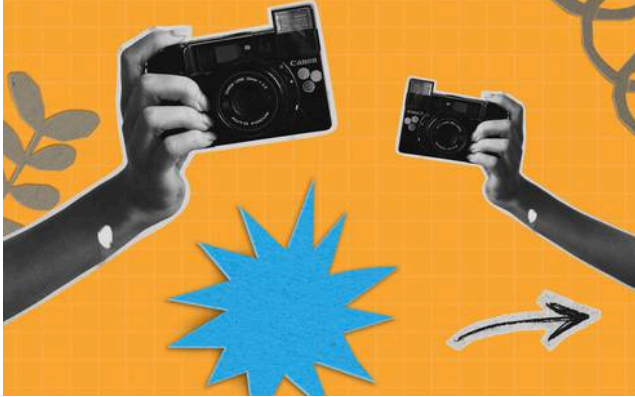
