

Goomalling Sport & Community Centre goes solar

Mortlock Sports Council and Goomalling Shire Council have invested in 30kw worth of solar panels for the Goomalling Sport & Community Centre (GSCC). With increased refrigeration for a commercial kitchen and bar the electricity consumption of the facility has significantly increased.

By installing solar panels on the GSCC Council is endeavouring to reduce its environmental impact and minimise operational costs of the facility. The exercise will provide a sound case study for transitioning other Council and community facilities to solar power.

Large cactus find thanks to the community

Thanks to a report from the community, a large infestation of Velvet Pear has been recorded near Walyormouring Lake. This find almost doubles the number of known plants within the Shire. Please keep your notifications coming in! Apart from the extensive infestation within the town limits, we also have recordings at Jennacubbine town site, Rowles Rd, Cockerding Brook and Konnongorring town site.

With over 60 sites of Cactus confirmed in the Shire of Goomalling, the time is getting closer to implement eradication procedures.

1. Small plants, less than 1 metre can be dug up and disposed of at the Shire disposal pit (Not the Tip!!). As an alternative, you can spray with Roundup®. Gardening Australia has a non-chemical method: add a cup of common salt to a litre of vinegar; after it's dissolved, brush it directly onto weeds. Remember, it's not a selective weed killer. It'll kill anything it touches so be very careful how you use it.
2. Larger plants, above 1m may also be dug up; the Shire of Goomalling will make its equipment available for this. Please contact Jean Walker, phone 0428100910 or works supervisor Russell Beck: works@goomalling.wa.gov.au to arrange this. As always plants need to be buried more than 1 metre deep. Herbicide Chemicals listed as registered are:
 - a. **Grazon Extra® 350 mL + 500 mL Uptake oil® per 100 litres of water OR**
 - b. **Garlon® 2 L + 500 mL uptake oil® per 100 litres of oil. Please follow all safety precautions when spraying.**

A reminder that all cactus species are declared within Western Australia, and the common cactus for Goomalling – Velvet Pear- is a Weed of National Significance (WONS). This means you are required by law to manage them.

Community Development update

Community Garden

Volunteers are working hard to get the community garden up and running for everyone to enjoy. Some 120 hours have been put into planning, development and implementation of the collective vision. The permaculture course set the foundation for the garden design using techniques such as swales to maximise water capture from the lay of the land (pictured right) and a variety of planning techniques such as herb spirals, mandala and keyhole gardens to maximise limited space. The garden will demonstrate a variety of these learned techniques, providing a platform for knowledge sharing and socialising.

Hazelnuts, fig, weeping mulberry, orange, lemon, mandarin, passionfruit, pomegranates and lime create the “Food Forest” and so much more nourishing foods are still to come as we continue to establish the Noongar bush tucker garden and vegetable boxes.

Encouraging the involvement from the local kids is an integral part of the garden. Volunteers attended a planting session with the Better Beginning group where kids decorated their own cup to plant herbs and flowers. The kids had a fantastic time and donated some of their plantings to the garden. These have been planted at the site, each one labelled with their name on it so they can visit and witness the growth of “their plant”.



Congratulations to all the volunteers for achieving so much in a short space of time, without you the garden wouldn't flourish.

Kristina Perrin to represent Australia in the Karate1 Premier League Leipzig, Germany

Kristina Perrin is Council's employee; she has been working with the Shire of Goomalling for twelve months as an administrative trainee.

In 2014 (age 19) Tina established a Wadu Ryu chapter of Karate in Goomalling, the club currently has 35 active members. Tina runs classes weekly with no remuneration with the hope of sharing the life changing sport with other young people in the community.

Tina is an elite athlete in the martial arts medium of Karate, learning in the Wadu Ryu chapter in Northam from the age of six she has developed her skills to become the defending champion for Western Australia Open Women's division for the past five years. The Oceania and Australian champion for 2016 and recently defended her title in Sydney, winning Gold at the Oceania Championship.

Sunday 5th August Kristina competed in the 2017 Australian Open she won two gold and one bronze, securing her place in the Australian team for the Karate 1 Premier League event, Leipzig, Germany. The K1 Premier League event will be Tina's debut on the international stage as an open competitor and her first time exposed to the European competition.

Tina's ambition is to compete on the European circuit in preparation for the Olympics in Tokyo 2020 where karate will debut. In order for Tina to compete in the Australian Team it is compulsory for her to compete in the following events:

1 x World Karate Federation, K1 Premier League Event (Northern hemisphere)
Oceania Championships, Sydney
Australia Open, Sydney
5 x Australian team camps, Melbourne/Sydney

Nominations are called for the Shire of Goomalling in-person elections, to be held on Saturday 21 October 2017 to fill vacancies on the Goomalling Shire Council as detailed below.

- Nominations must be lodged by **4.00pm on Thursday 14th September 2017**

Nomination must be lodged with the Returning Officer at any time during the above period at the office of the Shire of Goomalling.


Nomination requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- A completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Shire of Goomalling.
- A single A4 page profile containing no more than 150 words of biographical information about the proposed candidate and statements of the candidate's policies or beliefs.
- A nomination deposit of \$80 (cash, postal order or bank cheque subject to Returning Officer approval)
- A recent passport sized photograph (optional)

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered; posted or faxed; or sent by any electronic means, providing a hard copy of the nomination can be printed in full including your signature; to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations. 

Proper chemical container rinsing can save you money. It's simple. Uncleaned containers with left over residue could contain up to \$10 worth of product.

drumMUSTER suggests the following steps to prevent you pouring money down the drain:



1. Rinse out your *drumMUSTER* containers immediately after using them.

Will You Be Bushfire Ready?

With winter now behind us, the Shire urges all residents to ensure that their properties and families are prepared for bush fire season.

All residents should be assessing their properties and ensuring that they comply with the requirements of Shire of Goomalling [Firebreak Order](#) – this was recently sent with rate notices to property owners and is also available on the Shire's website.

Now is also a good time to ensure that all firefighting equipment and vehicles are fully serviceable. This includes pumps, fuels, hoses and fittings.

Ranger Update

Pet registrations

In accordance Cat Act 2011 and Dog Act 1976 respectively

- Cats must be **registered, de-sexed and microchipped** they're **6 months old**.
- Dogs must be **registered and microchipped** before they're **3 months old**.
- If you rehome an unwanted cat or dog, they **MUST** be microchipped and de-sexed prior to rehoming regardless of how young they are.
- Owners of cats and dogs need to register/renew registration of their pets by **31st October**.

Dog owners – WARNING!

Council has received a number of reports of dog poo on footpaths and at the recreation ground, creating an unpleasant experience for people utilising those facilities. Council allows people to use the recreation ground as a leash free area for dog owners enabling play and exercise for their furry family members.

It is **OWNERS responsibility** to clean-up after their animals. There is a **GREEN bin** located at the recreation ground for dog faeces, with a supply of plastic bags. This will be monitored by the ranger to make sure there is an adequate supply.



If Council continues to get reports of dog poo, particularly at the recreation ground it will revoke the use of recreation ground as a dog exercise area and dogs will have to be taken outside of the town site for exercise. This will result in \$200 fine for people exercising their dogs at the recreation ground if the changes are imposed.

\$200 FINE INFRINGEMENT applies to Owners who don't pick up their dog's poo.

NOTE: the recreation ground and town streets are under **surveillance and will be monitored.**

Road train permits

CLASS 2, 3 & 4 NETWORK ROAD TRAINS TRAVERSING ON LOCAL ROADS REQUIRE PERMIT FROM COUNCIL

It has come to our attention that a number of pocket road train owners are traversing within the Shire without a current Council endorsed permit. If you hold a Main Roads WA permit you are still required to obtain a permit from Council to traverse on *local roads*.

Please be advised that the \$11.00 Administration Charge (including GST) per Pocket Road Train configuration is required to validate your permit each year and that permission will be granted on an annual basis.

Permits will not be valid unless a receipt for the appropriate amount is attached.

Should you wish to renew your permit or apply for a new permit, please apply in writing advising of all Prime Mover and Trailer Registrations, along with \$11.00 per configuration. Your permit will be valid from date of receipt of the application until the same date the following year.

Implications to consider for non-compliance

- It may implicate insurance pay out of claims on vehicle without a valid permit
- It may implicate Main Roads Heavy Vehicle Permit
