Nature of Council's Role in the Matter

Executive: As part of all Native Title Claims in the South West, the South West Settlement Agency through the Department of Lands and the Department of Premier and Cabinet is seeking Council's views of the submitted 24 parcels of land in the Goomalling Townsite and within the Shire of Goomalling District.

Purpose of Report

The department is seeking Council's comments as to the land assembly process where Council may consider that three (3) parcels of land could remain in Council's vesture as custodian of the Reserves for Recreation and Vegetation.

Background

The proposed 24 parcels of land are to be transferred to the Noongar Boodja Trust as part of the South West Settlement Land Base Package. Then it is intended that post settlement the land will be transferred as Freehold, however, SWALSC/Noongar Boodja Trust will have the opportunity to select the land at a lesser tenure, being Reserve WPL, Reserve or Lease hold as the process moves forward.

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Comments & Details

Council has been requested to review the document and provide any relevant comments with respect to the following:

- 1. Any future proposals for the land identified. If so, in what timeframe?
- 2. Any known land management issued (contamination, vermin etc.)
- 3. Any other relevant comments.

As mentioned in the above Purpose of Report, Council should consider the three (3) parcels of land: One in White Street as part of the Recreation Reserve, one located previously as a Vegetation Reserve south of the Caravan Park land and one on 75 Throssell Street (Cnr Eaton). The three areas are highlighted in yellow;

Lot 500 White Street

Lot 500-133 Slater Street.

The land in White Street formed part of the Recreation Reserve and the land in Slater Street was part of the Vegetation Reserve where the Red Orchid plants are found.

75 Throssell Street is currently a residential block, Council has submitted an application to Department of Land to change the area to a recreation space for the development of a Natureplay® Playground to incorporate an aboriginal community art installation and noongar welcome statement. Refer to Attachment No. 2

Naturally it would be beneficial all three (3) areas of land are retained by Council as part of the three mentioned purposes "Recreation" and "Vegetation".

Council may view my input as intrusion for these three (3) lots but looking at the big picture the retention of the three (3) lots would be beneficial for all sectors of our community to remain as detailed purposes. The SWLS acquisition of said reserve means the possibility of development which could disrupt the natural environment, it's in Council's and the community's interest to preserve the reserves and ensure conservation of the natural environment. Aboriginal peoples are able to freely wander and utilise the reserve and wouldn't be implicated by Council's retention of the land.

Implications to consider

There are no financial implications, there is potential for implication to the environment should the areas be developed. This issue but could be construed as

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invasive but as I have said it is not but is detailed what

is best for all sectors of the community.



12.8 <u>CARBON ADVISORY SERVICES</u>

Background

Australia's climate has warmed since national records began in 1910, especially since 1950. Mean surface air temperature has increased by 0.9°C since 1910. Daytime maximum temperatures have increased by 0.8°C over the same period, while overnight minimum temperatures have warmed by 1.1 °C. The warming trend occurs against a background of year-to-year climate variability, mostly associated with El Niño and La Niña in the tropical Pacific.



The <u>2014</u> State of the <u>Climate</u> report states that since 2001, the number of extreme heat records in Australia has outnumbered extreme cool records by almost 3 to 1 for daytime maximum temperatures, and almost 5 to 1 for night-time minimum temperatures.

Very warm months that occurred just over 2 per cent of the time during the period 1951 to 1980 occurred nearly 7 per cent of the time during 1981 to 2010, and around 10 per cent of the time over the past 15 years. At the same time the frequency of very cool months has declined by around a third since the earlier period.

The duration, frequency and intensity of heatwaves have increased across large parts of Australia since 1950. There has been an increase in extreme fire weather, and a longer fire season, across large parts of Australia since the 1970s.

Rainfall averaged across Australia has slightly increased since 1900, with a large increase in north-west Australia since 1970. A declining trend in winter rainfall persists in south-west Australia. Autumn and early winter rainfall has mostly been below average in the south-east since 1990.

Council signed the WALGA Climate Change Declaration acknowledging the need to take immediate Climate Action; therefore it is imperative Council commence the process in order to reduce their impact on the environment.

Carbon Neutral

The cost for their services is \$4500.00 excluding GST for the monitoring over the 12 month period and developing the plan. Additional it will require time investment from Council staff to assist with relevant data collection.

Their service has been prompt and reflective of our goals. The following Councils have utilised their services City of Perth, City of Joondalup, City of Rockingham, City of South Perth, City of Fremantle and other iconic business such as Water Corporation, Toyota and ECU.

These services are not budgeted for 2015/16 and will therefore require an amendment, 20% or \$990.00 is due in the 2015/16 financial year whilst the remaining \$3960.00 is due in the 2016/17 financial year. Long term the services will assist Council to reduce its ongoing costs and reduce our local carbon emissions in line with Australia's 2030 Emission Reduction Target.
